## Townsend

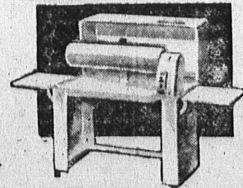

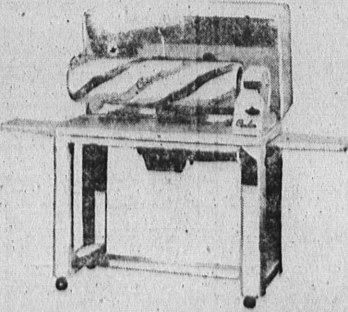
