Church Meeting**

The annual meeting of the congregation of the Central Evangelical United Brethren Church will be held Wednesday evening May 25, announced the Rev. H. Wesley Roloff, pastor.

The meeting will be preceded by a potluck supper in the Guild Hall. Mrs. Alice Speheler is in charge of the preparations for the dinner.

Election of a trustee, the Sunday School superintendent, and consideration of the budget for the coming year will be the main business of the meeting, according to the pastor. These include the election of the trusteeship now held by Merle Johnston. Johnston holds one of the five trusteeships which are filled for five-year terms on succeeding years. The remaining trustees include Willard Haslam, Albert Mc Ness, Dan McCormack, and Kenneth Luther.

The position of Sunday School superintendent also will be voted upon. The position is now held by W. E. Bowen, who has been superintendent for the past 23 years, with the exception of the period from 1946-1948.

Budgets for the coming year of June 1, 1949 to May 30, 1950 will be considered also.

Roloff extended a special invitation to new members who were received into the church this year to attend the affair.

Reverend Torben Olsen of the Saint Andrews Episcopal Church announced this week his resignation as rector of the church to leave for Fort Bragg, North Carolina on May 24 for an extended period of active duty with the U.S. Army.

It is not expected that a new rector for the church will be appointed for several weeks, according to Reverend Olsen.

Since coming to Torrance from Hanford, California, in November of 1947, Reverend Olsen has taken an active part in civic affairs. He currently is president of the Torrance Ministerial Association, and Chairman of the Welfare Council. He is also a member of the Torrance Recreation Commission and the Torrance Rotary Club.

He formerly served as chaplain in the National Guard, 40th Division Artillery.

Mrs. Olsen will remain in Torrance until the reverend is assigned a permanent station.
