The State law says who may receive benefits, how such work-ers shail qualify, how much they may receive each week, and for how many weeks they may re-ceive it. The State employment security agency makes the rules for the payment of benefits, han-dles the claims of unemployed workers, and decides in each case whether benefits shall be naid.

workers, and decides in each case whether benefits shall be pad, as whether benefits shall be pad, the Federal Government is responsible for the overall management of the system. These Federal duties are carried out by the Social Security Administration and the United States Treasury. As long as each State law and the operation of it are in line with Federal requirements the Federal Government pays to the State the cost of administering the law. The social security account number that is issued to each worker is used for both systems—old-age and survivors and unemployment insurance. The social security administration uses the number to identify the worker's account for old-age and survivors insurance; the State employment security agency uses it to identify the worker's unemployment insurance account.

Applications for unemployment insurance payments should be made at the worker's nearest local State employment office. In Torrance that office is located at 1628 Cravens Avenue.



The half hour long fireworks, which will start at 8:15-p.m. on July Fourth, will be visable from the hills and roads on the seaside of Rancho Palos Verdes.
