## Underway

This sum will be made avail-able to the County Engineer and Surveyor's Office next July 1, when the fiscal year starts. The plan includes three trans-fer site dumps to be set up in the South Pasadena, Huntington Park and El Segundo-Manhattan districts. Work was well underway this week on construction of addi-tional facilities at Fern Avenue Elementary School, Board of Ed-ucation officials stated. The units are to be completed

The units are to be completed and ready for occupancy by the beginning of the fall term in Construction of additional units at Perry School and the erection of a new school at Seaside Ranchos also is under-way. Both are expected to be completed by autumn.

"Other dump or transfer sta-tions should not be constructed until the next fiscat year, after expérience has been gained in the operation of these initial dumps," he stated. The transfer sites, complete with ramps and all necessary equipment, will be only tempor-ary depositories for rubbish pending transfer to the city ter-race site. The county manager favored financing of the disposal sites from \$818,000 set up for the now abandoned southeast incin-crator.




