Born in Truro, Cornwall, England, Mr. Solomon came to the United States 37 years ago arriving in Torrance in 1919. He has been a property owner here for 30 years. He was employed at Pacific Electric Company and at National Supply Company as a tool maker. Following a few years spent in San Fernando Valley, he and his family returned here in 1945 and purchased their present home.

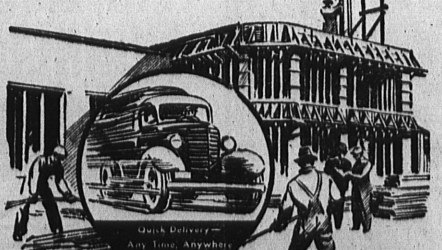
Solomon's interest in music gave him much pleasure all during his lifetime. His excellent tenor voice which he used unselfishly in choir and adult choral groups and his participation in concert work all prepared him for his most recent interest in organizing into a choir a group of 10-12 year-old boys of St. Andrew's Episcopal Sunday School. The realization of this plan, had he lived, might have come this fall with the arrival of a new rector at St. Andrew's.

A fascinating hobby which also occupied much of his leisure time since his retirement was the making of model engines.

Survivors are his wife, Mrs. Minnie B. Solomon, of the home address; a daughter, Mrs. Jeanne Louise McDaniel and two granddaughters, Lee Ann and Judith Elaine, all of Compton.

Also surviving are three cousins, Jack Brown, Chicago; Beatrice Trathen, Ohio; and Dorothy Kurth, Maryland.

Death came to the Torrance pioneer as he was preparing his car for a fishing trip to Crowley Lake where he and Mrs. Solomon planned to fish this week.
