Valuation Tax Info Explained

County assessor John R. Quinn will hold open house on the third floor of the Hall of Justice for property owners wanting to know the amount of their 1949-50 assessed valuation.

Quinn advises that property owners seeking such information to bring last year's tax receipt or legal description of the real estate in order to help locate the property on the assessment roll in 220 volumes containing 1,400,000 separately described individual real estate parcels.

If a property owner feels his holding has been assessed too high in comparison with his neighbor's, he may petition for a hearing before the Board of Supervisors, which will sit as an equalization body for the next three weeks.

Welsh announced that registrations for the summer program had mounted this week to more than 771 children who are taking advantage of the facilities provided at the six centers.

The three centers with the largest registration are Torrance Park, 188; Fern Avenue School, 177; and Walteria, 129.

U. S. May Enter Smog Picture

The U. S. Bureau of Mines may enter the smog picture here as a result of Dr. Louis C. McCabe, smog director, resigning his post here, and joining the mines bureau staff in Washington, D. C.

In the course of a brief ceremony recently as he formally relinquished his post as head of the Los Angeles air pollution control district, he said that the Bureau of Mines has authorized him to send a team of scientists here next August to spend two months studying the smog problem.

McCabe also said that he himself has been authorized to return here every 90 days to study progress.

He expressed a special interest in trying to combat smog damage to leafy vegetable and alfalfa crops, particularly in the San Gabriel valley.

During the 15 months that Dr. McCabe has functioned here, it is estimated that the smog nuisance has been reduced 20 per cent.

Gordon P. Larson, former Army engineering officer and more recently deputy director of the district, succeeded Dr. McCabe.

The new smog enforcement officer vowed to continue to push the present vigorous two-pronged program of enforcement and research.

College Adds Poultry Course for Veterans

El Camino College is adding to its curriculum a course in poultry and rabbit raising for veterans who are using on-the-farm training under their veterans benefits. First meeting of the class was held for July 5, 6:30 p. m. in Building C-3, at the college campus on Crenshaw and Redondo Beach boulevards.

This course which will carry two units of credit for the six weeks summer session has been added to the college curriculum, according to Dr. Lyle Tussing, Director of Instruction, because of the need for supplemental training by veterans who are employed in learning poultry and rabbit raising under the G. I. Bill.

The class will be under the direction of Clifford Fursdon, well known poultry man in this

area. Fursdon will be assisted by Leon Erlin. Erlin has his Bachelor of Science degree from the University of California at Los Angeles in the field of agriculture. Dr. Tussing reports that the college is already offering a similar course that is open to veterans who are employed in the field of horticulture. This class which now includes some 25 young veterans

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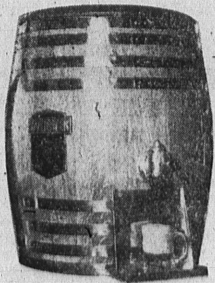
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
