To School-Bound

Veterans who are thinking about returning to school next fall under either the GI Bill of Rights or State educational assistance programs would do well to take prompt action to get their papers in order, in the opinion of Mrs. Helen K. Dill, director of the Veterans Service Center in Torrance.

"If you're merely continuing a course at the same school you attended last' semester, your problems are probably already taken care of." Mrs. Dill said. "But if you're transferring, just starting, or resuming school, or are at or near the end of your Pederal entitlement and want to shift over to State aid. there's paper work to be done."

Virtually all of this preliminary documentation, such as certificates of eligibility, can be handled smoothly during the summer months. Walfing until registration time in the fall means getting caught in a rush and possible delay in subsistence checks, Mrs. Dill warned.
