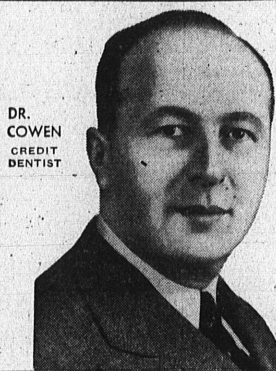
**HOME AGAIN**

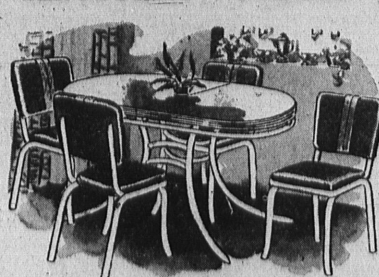
