### RED CROSS SUPPLIES ARE RUSHED TO AID EARTHQUAKE VICTIMS

Fifty-five tons of tenting, enough to shelter some 3,000 persons, are being shipped by the American Red Cross to earthquake devastated Ecuador, where thousands are homeless. It was announced this week by Bowen McCoy, manager of the local chapter.

McCoy said the tents already had been drawn from U. S. Army quartermaster stores in the Panama Canal Zone and would be sent to Ecuador by the fastest possible means. Also being shipped are 2,000 blankets, 500 pounds of DDT, 10 lyster bags and calcium hypochloride for water purification. The American Red Cross will reimburse the Army for the supplies drawn.

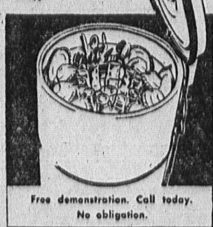
