MODERN DRIVING TESTERS WILL ENTER CLASSROOMS

Driver education testing devices will be furnished free to every secondary school in the state of California by General Petroleum Corporation, the company announced last week.

The company made the offer in the light of the recent law passed by the State Legislature making driver training mandatory in the secondary schools.

A total of 150,000 high school students are expected to take driver training courses during the coming academic year.

Earl J. Stanley, assemblyman from Orange County, who sponsored the new law, commenting on General Petroleum's action, said:

"We expect these training devices to be of material assistance to our program of making every high school student in California a safe driver."

The testing devices are designed to accomplish four results:

1. Draw attention to the psycho-physical traits of individual drivers and to the importance of driver efficiency and safety;
2. Develop an awareness in the student of his psycho-physical limitation, and teach him how he may overcome them;
3. Demonstrate the interdependence of all drivers and
4. Aid the student to overcome a self-centered attitude, and to show due consideration for all other cars and pedestrians.
