National Guard 40th Infantry Has 3,006 Men

Aggregate strength of the 40th Infantry Division, California National Guard, today stood at 3,006 officers, warrant officers and enlisted men, it was announced by Brig. Gen. Daniel H. Hudelson, division commander.

"Currently, we are enlisting about 480 men per month—a rate several times higher than at any time before World War II," the general said. "We feel our record speaks for itself, since the division's strength was zero a little more than a year ago." He pointed out that the division now requires the full time services, for training supervision and administrative purposes, of 40 regular army men and 96 other federal and state employees.

The regular army has provided the division two colonels, three lieutenant colonels, two majors, three captains and 30 sergeants. Federal and state employes rosters include one lieutenant colonel, one raajor, three captains, one civilian and 90 sergeants.

Thirty-seven of the full-time personnel are stationed in the division's headquarters armory in Exposition park, Los Angeles. The remainder are stationed at Torrance, Santa Maria, Santa Barbara, Ventura, Oxnard, Burbank, Glendale, Pasadena, Alhambra, Santa Monica, Highland Park, South Gate, Sierra Madre, El Monte, Arcadia, Ontario, Pomona, Fontana, Montebello, Monrovia, San Bernardino, Riverside, Redlands, Beaumont, Hemet, Corona, Colton, Santa Ana, Orange, Fullerton and Anaheim.

Term Extended For Veterans' Life Insurance

World War II veteracs now have an additional seven months period in which to reinstate lapsed National Service Life Insurance term policies, L. C. Chapman, manager, Veterans Administration, Los Angeles Regional office announced.

The Dec. 31 deadline, Chapman said, has been extended to July 31, 1948 by Omar N. Clark, Acting Administrator of Veteran Affairs, in order that veterans may have an opportunity to reinstate lapsed NSLI policies without necessity of taking physical examinations.

Under liberalized reinstate ment procedures, Chapman ex plained, World War II veterans may now reinstate their lapsed term policies merely by pay ing two monthly premiums and signing comparative health statements that they are in as good health today as when the policies lapsed.


