

City Basketball Loop Opens Play Monday Night In High School Gym

Four teams of the major division of the Torrance Basketball League swing into action Monday evening as official league play begins.

The league, co-sponsored by the Torrance evening High School and the City Recreation Department, will consist of five teams in the major division and a probable minimum of four teams in the minor division.


Monday night's games will match Torrance Merchants and Fenwick's Shoe Repair starting at 7:15. The second game, starting at 8:30, will pair Redondo Eagles and Klink's Cabrillo Mart. Goodyear Synthetic Rubber, the fifth team in upper competition, draws a first-round bye.

At Tuesday night's meeting of league managers, Elmer "Red" Moon was elected chairman pro tempore of the organization. At the same time schedules were drawn up and numerous rules adopted. "Red" Moon and Dan Moon were named to referee the contests.

Formation of the minor division league has been slower but at least three teams have been assured and possibly one or two more. Teams lined up already are the Five Old Men, National Home Appliance and the Baptist Church. John's Club and Phalanx Club remain as possible entries.

All games in the league will be played in the gymnasium of the Torrance High School.

Hunting Season May Be Cut By Fifteen Days

Game management area regulations curtailing the hunting season by 15 days and prohibiting the taking of hen pheasants were among proposals made by the California Fish and Game Commission at their December meeting held last week in San Francisco.

Under a recent legislative act which sets a 30-day minimum between publication of proposed regulations and final action, the commissioners have mailed their recommendations to the state's 24 game management area operators before setting the 1948 rulings at a meeting in Los Angeles Jan. 30 and 31.

Other proposed changes in the game management program include: Possession limits of birds taken shall be the same as daily bag limits; licensees shall make semi-monthly reports to the Division of Fish and Game, and one-third of the pheasants released in a management area shall be hens.

Some California sportsmen have voiced objection to the management area program created by the 1939 Legislature which allows licensed landowners to kill pheasants and quail purchased for release on private property. Only 36 percent of the November quota of the game birds released on game management areas have been killed, according to Ben Glading, assistant chief of the Bureau of Game Conservation.

Hard-hitting fullback Bill Stits and rugged tackle, Ralph Collins, last week made the 1947 All-Marine League eleven. Stits, only an A-10, is a repeater from last season, who was chosen despite the fact that he was injured during part of the 1947 campaign. Collins, an A-12, received the honor for the

The Southern California Board of Football made the selections in cooperation with the Helms Athletic Foundation.

San Pedro, which finished below Gardena, due to the fact that Pirates were upset by Narbonne in the final game, nevertheless placed five men on the first team to Gardena's four. Only one Banning man, Guard Paul Martinez, was named on the first string.

Narbonne was represented on the second team with five players. Both starting ends, Jack Garrabrant, who finished the season as a fullback, and rags-to-riches Andy Spaan, who came to the top from deep down among the reserves, were named on the second string.

Gaucha quarterback Jack Allen, Center Alfred Dudley and Guard Bill Kelley were also selected for the second team.

Gardena had four second string representatives; San Pedro, two; and Banning one.

Chosen as player of the year in the Marine League was Don Bahman, tiny T-formation quarterback for the champion Gardena Mohicans. Bahman, who stands 5 feet 7 inches and weighs 142 pounds, sparked the Mohicans to the title by pitching seven touchdown passes in six games. He also scored two touchdowns, one on a 95-yard kickoff return, and had a 40-yard punting average.

Ernie High and Bill Wagner of San Pedro both earned first team backfield berths despite the fact that High was injured for half the season.

James Charles, powerful Gardena fullback, was chosen for the 12th "blocking back" berth on the first string.

Fred Ihde, San Pedro end, who in this writer's estimation had to give way in every department in favor of Gaucha Garrabrant, was paired with Gardena's Norman Earley at the first team end spots.

Myron Schlaegel of Gardena, definitely a first-rate lineman, was teamed with Collins at the tackle posts.

Fred Grgich of San Pedro was selected with Banning's Martinez at the guard positions. Clyde Miller of San Pedro was named to the pivot post in a doubtful choice over the Gauchos' Dudley.

1948 Fishing Licenses Now Being Issued

Three million dollars worth of 1948 fishing licenses were on sale at 2,600 agencies and seven offices of the Division of Fish and Game.

The angling permits provide the major source of revenue for the division's wildlife conservation programs.

California citizens will pay \$3-\$1 more than last year—for their 1948 licenses, while the alien license charge has been boosted from \$5 to \$25. Besides upping the license fees, the 1947 Legislature made it mandatory that anglers over the age of 16 possess a license. A license is now required for taking any type of fish in California waters.

A new classification of fishing license will be available for the first time when the division offers 10-day non-resident permits for \$3. Seasonal non-resident fees are a minimum of \$5, with reciprocal charges according to state of residence. Dunbar said angling licenses—required for all fishing after Jan. 1—will be sold at Fish and Game offices in Sacramento, San Francisco, Fresno, Terminal Island, Los Angeles, San Diego and Redding, as well as 2,600 sporting goods, hardware and business establishments.

EMPLOYEE HOUSES WILL BE BUILT AT HARBOR HOSPITAL

Ten family dwellings will be constructed on the property of the Harbor General Hospital, according to plans announced last week by J. E. Smits, superintendent.

Material for the construction was procured recently through the War Assets Administration by the County of Los Angeles. The lumber for the dwellings was derived from the tearing down of buildings at Camp Anza.

The dwellings will be occupied by employees at the Harbor hospital.
