
Under a recent legislative act which sets a 30-day minimum between publication of proposed regulations and final action, the commissioners have mailed their recommendations to the state's 24 game management area operators before setting the 1948 rulings at a meeting in Los Angeles Jan. 30 and 31.

Other proposed changes in the game management program include:

Possession limits of birds taken shall be the same as daily bag limits; licensees shall make semi-monthly reports to the Division of Fish and Game, and one-third of the pheasants released in a management area shall be hens.

Some California sportsmen have voiced objection to the management area program created by the 1939 Legislature which allows licensed landowners to kill pheasants and qualipurchased for release on private property. Only 36 percent of the November quota of the game birds released on game management areas have been killed, according to Ben Glading, assistant chief of the Bureau of Game Conservation.
