State Aid Is **Available To Vets Survivors**

Many children of veterans who died as a result of war service do not realize that they may be entitled to financial assistance from the State of California while attending high school and college, in addition to any federal compensation they may be receiving. J. G. Caldwell, director of the Torrance Area Veterans Service Center, said today.

State aid of \$20 a month for high school or \$40 a month for college or trade school is provided by the State Veterans Dependents Educational Act. This assistance also is available to widows of deceased veterans under certain circumstances.

Those eligible are widows and children of servicemen who were killed in service during either world war, or who died later as a result of a war service connected disability.
