### **Trout Season Dates Fixed By** State Officials

A state-wide May 1 opening for the trout season and an all-year-round open season on black bass beginning May 1, has been set by the California Fish and Game Commission.

Efforts upon the part of the Bureau of Fish Conservation based upon biological research to divide the state into two areas, with 17 southern counties opening the trout season May 1, and the remainder of the state opening the trout season May 30, has been defeated.

Practically every other item in the Bureau of Fish Conservation program was approved by the commission.
These included:

1. The existing bag limit for stripe d bass was modified which prohibites the possession of twenty-five pounds of striped bass and one fish in any one day.

2. Bag limits, in the aggre-

bass and one fish in any one day.

2. Bag limits, in the aggregate, of three steelhead and salmon in northern coastal streams, and limits of two steelhead and salmon in southern coastal streams.

3. A reduction in the pismo clam bag limit from 15 to 10.

4. A six fish bag limit on mullet taken in the Salton Sea. The trout limit, which also applies to Rocky Mountain whitefish, remains unchanged, fifteen fish or ten pounds and one fish. Removing the size limit on golden trout and reducing the bag limit to conform to other trouts. limit t
