"Federal aid to education as proposed under Senate Bill 472, currently before the House education and labor committee, would be a blanket encroachment of the federal government on local government and home rule and, as such, is an issue of grave importance to California, "said A. C. Hardison, of Santa Paula, president of California Taxpayers' association and prominent citrus grower. "All citzens should familiarize themselves with its implications," he continued. "Public education has always been a state function, and a local responsibility," Hardison declared. "It is not to be expected that every state will the same amount, use indentical methods, or get the same results.
