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Fire Hazard May Change Hunting Season in '48

Recommendations for California's 1948 hunting seasons on deer, bear, and upland game generally similar to last year's regulations were presented by the Division of Fish and Game and organized sportsmen during the April regulatory powers hearing of the Fish and Game Commission.

In a two-day meeting (April 9 and 10) at the State Building in Los Angeles, the Commission heard proposals of the Bureau of Game Conservation to set a coastal area deer hunting season from August 7 to September 15, with a two-deer bag limit, and a one-deer Sierra season from September 16 to October 15.

Before setting 1948 regulations at a meeting in San Francisco April 29 and 30, the Commission will consider the appeal of the State Board of Forestry to abolish hunting during the month of September because of extreme fire hazards. Alternate seasons eliminating most of the month of September were presented by the Bureau.

Shooting hours for pheasants, quail, squirrels, and rabbits would extend from 8 a.m. to sunset November 21 to December 3, when the proposed pheasant season closes, and from one-half hour before sunrise to one-half hour after sunset from December 3 to December 31 for other game.

Presenting joint recommendations for the first time as the Organized Sportsmen of California, the three major sportsmen's groups—Associated Sportsmen, Central Council, and Southern Council of Conservation Clubs—recommended upland game seasons and bag limits generally in agreement with those submitted by the Division of Fish and Game, and similar to 1947 regulations.

Hunter asked an extended bear hunting season with a two-bear bag limit from November 1 to December 31. The hunting season would be two weeks longer than that of last year, when a one-bear bag limit was in effect.

Two Day Rodeo Features Champ, Trick Riders

Final arrangements have been completed for the 1948 World's Championship Rancho Palos Verdes Rodeo, to be sponsored by the Empty Saddle Club at its riding grounds in Rolling Hills Saturday and Sunday, with the engagement of Andy Jauregui, Saguas rodeo expert, to furnish riding and roping stock for the show.

Top supplier of stock for rodeos in the west for the past 12 years, Jauregui, who will be arena director this weekend, will provide all calves, roping steers, wild Brahma bulls, and bucking broncs for the championship events.

More than 100 contestants, including champion cowboys Jerry Ambler, Bug Blessing, Bud and Bill Linderman, and Casey Tibbs, are expected to participate, which should assure purses for each event of from \$700 to \$800 for the winners.

Top-flight bucking broncs slated for the show include Golden Rule, Will James, Pretty Socks, Ranger, New Deal and the infamous Miss Newhall. Music will be furnished by the Torrance Area Youth's Band, Inc.

Stuart Hamblin, cowboy rodeo star and owner of the race horse, El Lobo, will appear on both days to lead the grand entry and entertain the crowd with western songs.

Famous girl trick riders, Polly Burson and Edith Happy, will be on hand to thrill the spectators with their fancy riding, and Jess Kell, top rodeo clown, will keep the laughs going for the two-day show. Doc Keller, well-known rodeo announcer, will describe the various events.

Airport Visited By Group From Skyway No. 1

Torrance Municipal airport was one of 24 airports in Los Angeles County which marked the dedication Saturday of Skyway I, first transcontinental air-marked route for private pilots, President C. S. Beesemyer of U.S. Skyway One Association announced.

Five courier planes departed from Los Angeles Airport at 10 a.m. Saturday to visit Torrance and 22 other flying fields on Skyway I, the Wright Way, and deliver certificates recognizing them as providing adequate service for private sky travelers, Beesemyer said.

Members of the Ninety-Nines women pilots' organization, were in the role of couriers. The Ninety-Nines presented U. S. Skyway One Association certificates to officials at community airports as part of their dedicated programs.
