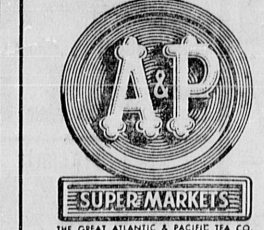
HEALTH OFFICER OF L.A. COUNTY WARNS OF CANNING PERILS

GILBERT, MD County Health Officer From the time spring strawberries first appear in the market and through the summer and fall, many housewives are busy canning extra products which they buy or raise themselves in their "Food for Freedom" gardens. This is a laudable task if it is done properly, but many women do not take the needed precautions in canning food. Severe or fatal poisoning may result. The soil of Southern California is rather heavily seeded with the dormant form of the germ which can cause a very severe and often fatal poisoning called botulism. The botulinus germ or bacillus is not so frequently found in the soil of some other sections of the nation, and fence women who have been in the habit of canning meat, bland fruits, and vegetables by the open kettle method before coming to California have many times been slow to realize that these foods need special attention. To be in the safe side, all non-acid food should be canned by the pressure cooker method. Even with this precaution, it should be boiled rapidly for 15 minutes after the jar is opened and before eating. If it is to be eaten cold, it should first be boiled and then allowed to cool. It is not possible to detect botulinus contaminated food by looks or smell, but even a tiny taste can be fatal. Foods pickled in vinegar are considered an acid food and as such, free from botulism. However, the vinegar should completely cover the food as the portion not covered can become non-acid and a breeding ground for bacillus botulinus.

Time To Apply For Absentee Vote Ballots

Citizens who are planning to be out of town on primary election day, June 1, will be able to apply for absentee ballots up to May 27, it was announced today by Supervisor William A. Smith, chairman of the "Get Out and Vote" citizens committee. First day to apply was May 12. Absentee ballots may be requested by mail by writing Registrar of Voters Michael J. Donoghue at 808 North Spring or by obtaining them in person from the registrar's office, Smith said. "The letter requesting the absentee ballot must contain the signature of the voter as he or she is registered, his registered address and the address to which the ballot should be mailed," Smith emphasized. "A postal card request is acceptable but each member of the family desiring to vote must sign a separate request to obtain a ballot." Smith reminded that the absentee ballot, he declared, must be returned to Donoghue's office. No telephone calls for absentee ballots will be accepted, he stated. Absentee ballots must be voted on or before June 1, and will be accepted by Donoghue if received not later than six days after election day. "All citizens who may not be able to get to the polls on June 1 should request an absentee ballot," he declared.
