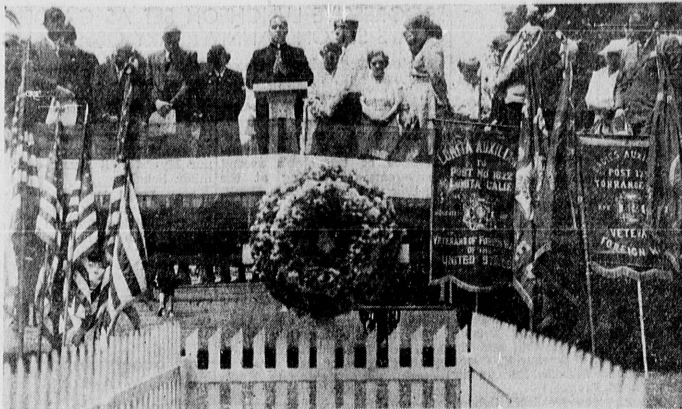

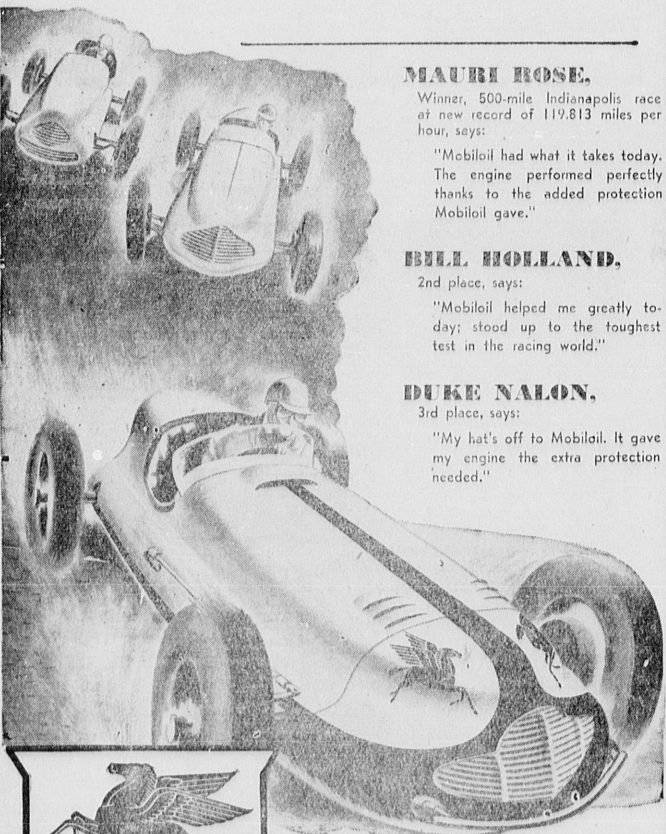

According to James Yeltema, owner of the Torrance Flower Shop, the Florists Association will route all orders through the Association Clearing House in Detroit, just as orders for flowers are cleared.

This brings convenient and expeditious CARE service into hundreds of towns and cities and thus will help many Americans to speed their contributions in the battle against starvation and malnutrition in Europe.

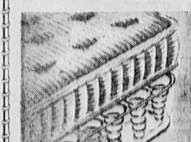

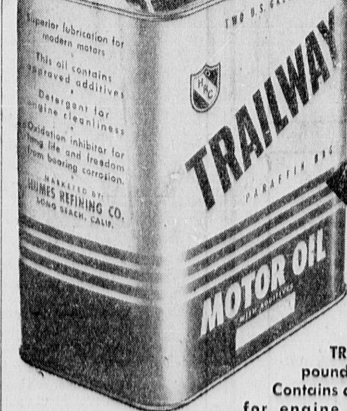
