Parents Urged to Eliminate 'Booby Traps'

Many tragic accidents could be avoided if well-meaning parents would make a check of hazards around the home before small children are injured, and sometimes maimed for life, according to Sheriff Eugene W. Biscailuz. There are many hazards, he says, which are an individual responsibility, such as conditions which might cause a child to be electrocuted.

"Have you warned your own or the neighborhood children, particularly the very small ones, of the danger of playing around fish-ponds?" the Sheriff asks. "Self-locking devices, such as disassembled refrigerators and trunks, present traps for children. Poisons in the garden, house or elsewhere and cleaning fluids or other liquids may be a fire hazard in their hands."
