With 14 localities topping the \$1,000,000-mark in building per-mits, the total of new Los An-geles county construction au-thorized in the first half of 1948 fell barely short of a half-billion dollars.

The mid-year total stood at \$455,927,610 in valuation of 91,275 permits in the cities and unincorporated area of Los Angeles county.

Residential permits numbering 32,126, were valued at \$289,166,174. All types of construction represented a 63 per cent gain over the \$284,240,-455 total for the first half sof 1947.

The 14 top areas last month, taside from the City of Los Anageles and the unincorporated area, were: San Fernando Valley, \$11,448,022; West Los Anageles, \$4,163,131; Long Beach, \$3,402,660; Venice, \$2,502,521; p. Santa Monica, \$1,970,000; Pasadena, \$1,883,444; Alhambra, \$1,\*\* 489,138; Arcadia, \$1,366,803.
