County Told Some 400 miles of divided high-way modernization and plan-ning is now under way in Southern California. An esti-mated \$25,000,000 was spent in this area during the past fis-cal year (July 1, 1947 to June 30, 1948) for construction and rightsofway developments. The breakdown in the past year's freeway spending included \$19, 000,000 in the Los Angeles area. Preliminary planning, tightof-way procurement and some con-struction work also was started last year on the following Los Angeles county. expressways: Harbor, Sepulveda, Inglewood, Riverside, Ramona, Santa Ana, River, Terminal Island, East By-Pass, Santa Monica and Olym-pic.
