This office has held on numerous occasions that it requires a vote of the people, and approval of the Legislature, to repeal this above quoted section. Chapter 7 of the charter adopts the civil service system of the city and contains among other matters, the collection.

The charter of any city or city and county may be amended by proposals therefor submitted by the legislative body thereof on its own motion and on petition signed by 15 percent of the registered electors, or both. Such proposals shall be submitted to the electors at either a special election called for that purpose or at any general or special election, amendments proposed by the legislative body and amendments proposed by petition of the electors may be submitted at the same election.
