Riviera Zoning Pleas Set For Hearing July 27

Next Tuesday evening has been set for the third and final hearing on three Torrance zon-ing matters involving areas in Hollywood Riviera and business property on Torrance boulevard.

The council last week voted to uphold the city planning commission in denying the Riviera Housing Torporation a change of zone affecting all of Tract 14898, in the Hollywood Riviera where a number of new homes are being constructed. The corporation sought a rezoning from A-1 to R-1 to permit residential development.

The council also upheld the planning body in its denial of a change of zone for Lots 9 to 18 and Lot 21 of Block F of Tract 10300, also located in Hollywood Riviera. Here the Hollywood Pevelopment Company asked rezoning from R-3 to C-2.


