Sandwich Spread Uses Olives as Main Ingredient

A number of novel sandwich spreads using olives as main ingredients, have been developed by the University of California Food Technology Division.

A pleasing sandwich filler can be obtained by mixing eight ounces of chopped walnuts, eight ounces of ground raisins and flour, eight ounces of mayonnaise, and salt to taste.

Another spread uses one pound of green Sevillano olives, pitted and coarsely ground, mixed with eight ounces of ground kippered sardines. Instead of the sardines, Norwegian kippered snacks can be used. A third variation adds to the snacks some ground pimiento, garlic and onion, as well as some tomato sauce and vinegar.
