The U. S. Automobile industry is seeking new locations for assembly plants in strategic areas all over the nation, and is embarking on a program of modernization and expansion of the 34 major new manufacturing and assembly plants built since the end of World War II, according to the Automobile Manufacturers Association.

There are now a total of 113 assembly plants in the nation, in 77 cities of the 24 states, "and the list will grow in the next few years," the statement adds, California has 17 of the 113 plants, eight being in Los Angeles, with Ford in Long Beach and Nash in El Segundo.

With the adjustment of steel prices this month, it is possible that new plants will find it advantageous to locate near sources of steel supply. Also, now that California has more cars than New York and is the fastest-growing section of the nation, the Torrance area particularly is in a favorable spot, it has been pointed out. One manufacturer reports another reason for building new plants is because traffic and parking problems in his main plant cities are affecting nis operating costs by delaying many workers' arrival on the job. The firm also finds that factory of ficiency suffers when more than 25,000 persons are employed in one plant.



Geneva Plant Is Readied as Local 'Feeder'

More than one-third of the plate mill conversion project under way at U. S. Steel's Geneva steel plant near Provo, Utah, has been completed, officials announced today.

When the project is finished, probably early in 1949, the Geneva plant will be equipped with facilities for the manufacture of coils of hot strip steel, in addition to plates and structural shapes which are presently manufactured there.

The coils then will be processed into coil rolled sheets and tin plate by U. S. Steel's Columbia Steel Company in California.

The project, officials explained, is the major part of a conversion program which the U.S. Steel Corporation agreed to undertake at the time of the Plant's purchase from the Government June 19, 1946 at an expenditure of not less than \$18,600,00.


