the coast circuit, while Bill Crutchfield, former U.S.C. captain and coach of the Torrance Scatters, Henry Cedillos, Skip Rowland, and Chuck Cheshire are listed among the ex-college stars who will twinkle under the arcs of the city park during the next month.

Jim Wayt, chairman of the American Legion, estimates that close to 2000 people will see some of these near-giants in one or more of the games during the double elimination affair. Other local men serving on the committee with Wayt are Lou Deinger, Les Fix, Charlie Dunham, Harry Atwood and "Spud" Murphy.

Dale Riley, city superintendent of recreation, who was instrumental in bringing the first tournament to Torrance in 1939, praised the Legion for allowing all kids under 15 to attend the games free of charge. Admission for adults this year was lowered to 50 cents.

Appearing frequently on many of the pre-tournament copy sheets is the name of Vic Penny and the Los Angeles Police Nine who captured the title last year. However, many of the teams who were entered last year figured they learned something and have packed their squads with last minute strength that will make it tough for the team that wades through the five or six game fight for the trophy.

City officials have been invited to attend the opening game which will get started when Mary Ellen Crawford, Torrance Queen, throws in the first ball.

Games will start at 8:15 p.m. each night.

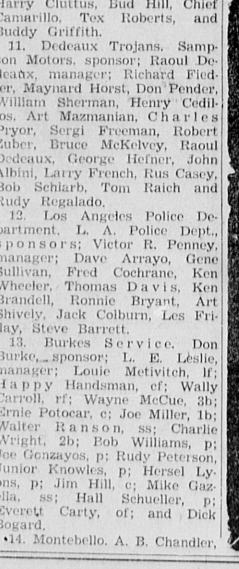
