Airline Owner 'Forced Out'

ton had repeatedly refused to negotiate with them when he assumed management of the airport. The company had previously been serving planes on the strip prior to the signing of the agreement that put Tarkington in as manager of the former Army air field.

Tarkington said yesterday that big commercial operators had no place on the field and were "slow credit." He claimed that Batchelor had been as long as 60 days in paying his rent on the hangar space. Batchelor yesterday produced bills presented by Tarkington, claiming payment for airplanes that Batchelor did not own. The bills, claims Batchelor, were paid after the errors were corrected by Tarkington after nearly a month's delay.

The former Army transport pilot who is now operating the \$100,000 yearly airline business claims he offered the city the sum of \$118,500 for ten year lease on the airport at the same time Tarkington put in his bid. He believes the letter never came before the council, since he has never received any communication stating that his letter had received consideration nor was it acknowledged.

City records show that up to the present time the city has netted \$1500 since June of 1947, according to Tarkington's remittances.

Councilman Bob Haggard inspected the airport Wednesday afternoon and talked with both Batchelor and Tarkington. He said he was not in a position to offer any opinion on the arrangement without further investigation but felt that whatever action takes place or is taking place the public should be fully informed at all times.
