Awards Due on Technical Junior College

Award of contracts for the first six units of the new Harbor Technical Junior College to be built in the newly-graded site on highway 101 and Vermont avenue was scheduled to be made this week.

Low bidder on the project was the Baruch Corporation at \$1,763,800, according to the Los Angeles Board of Education. Bids ranged up to \$1,943,663. This will make the third junior college in this area, the other two being El Camino College on the north boundary line of Torrance and Palos Verdes College in the Palos Verdes Hills.
