

School Time Means Chance for Infections

With the reopening of school in the fall there is usually a flare-up of skin diseases when students who have become infected during the summer pass on such infections to fellow pupils upon returning to school, according to the county health department.

Children should be taught not to borrow, or lend, each other's combs any more than they would borrow or lend a tooth brush. Head lice and ringworm of the scalp both may be passed on by using another's comb.

Scabies or "itch" may also be contracted from handling objects previously used by a person with this skin irritation. As an example, anyone with scabies hanging articles and then passing them to others may also pass on the infection.

Athlete's foot is another contagious skin disease which may be transmitted to others by way of infected locker and shower room floors, shoes, towels and the human body.

Home remedies are ineffective in many cases and the services of a physician should be sought in any skin infection. In case of a skin irritation, a careful examination should be made before the child enters school.
