# **Meat Supply** Outlook Dim. Says Advisor

The meat situation will not ee any substantial improve-nent until the fall of 1949,

see any substantial improvement until the fall of 1949, states C. V. Castle, Los Angeles county farm advisor, representing the University of California Agricultural Extension Service.

Castle points out there are several contributing factors to the present inflation in meat prices. First . . . the small corn crop of last fall, second . . . the high meat prices last year which caused producers to sell their cattle faster than they replaced them, and third . . . the present high per capita consumption of meat.

On the first count, last year's small corn crop contributed a great deal to the short feed supplies during the past winter and spring. The small corn crop meant a small pig crop, and a major part of our meat supply is pork. This year's big corn crop will improve the situation eventually, but not until about a year from now.

The second reason, the high prices which are causing producers to sell cattle faster than they replace them, has caused a drop of 7,000,000 thead in cattle numbers in the past three years. This overmarketing to meet an imme-

diate demand has created a serious problem.

The third contributing factor has been that we have continued to eat more meat than we did before the war. The per capita consumption of meat last year was 16 per cent above the prewar average, and is running 12 per cent above prewar this year. Per capita income is two and one-half times higher than the prewar average, which means people have more money to spend for meat.

What are the conclusions? It's still hard to say. If income stays

still hard to say. If income stay still hard to say. If income stays up, demand will stay up, and prices may increase even fur ther. The large grain crops this year will eventually relieve some of the pressure on beef when they have been converted into expanded production of eggs, poultry, and pork, Castle believes.
