Army Seeks Medical Men for Reserve

Due to the expansion of the Army and its desire to offer complete medical and dental care to all Army personnel and their dependents, the Surgeon General of the United States to-day announced a new program which offers unusual advantages for professional men.

Civilian interns are now eligible for Army Medical Corps Reserve commissions, and may continue their internship with full Army pay and allowances.

In any of three categories mentioned above, the minimum pay and allowances will amount to approximately \$300 per month.
