This week the date of Oct, 16 stands out in our history review. It marked both the beginning and the end of certain phases of World War II. On Oct 16, 1940, some 16 million Americans began to sign up for the first peace-time draft in our history. This was the first step toward organizing our manpower for the war that was to be thrust upon us a little more than a year later.

THIS WEEK IN HISTORY

Was the first step towart organises of the more than a year later. On Oct. 16, 1946, the finale was staged at the Nuremberg prison for 11 of Hitler's henchmen who had plotted and attempted to carry out the scheme for world conquest. Ten of them were hanged in the dark hours before dawn. The eleventh--Herman Goering--beat the noose by committing sui-cide shortly before he was to go to the gallows. He tools a poison capsule which he had succeeded in concealing during the 17 months he was in prison. The final score on the top Nazis was this: Five committed suicide--these included Hitler, Goebbels, Goering, Ley and Himmier; Martin Bormann, Hitler's right-hand man, is pre-sumed dead; ten were hanged; seven were sent to prison for terms ranging from ten years to life; three were freed. Oct. 16, thus marked the first chapter of World War II for 16 million young Americans and it marked the final chap-ter of World War II for the men who had launched that conflict.




