Records Show 1 Out of Every 12 Families Living With Relatives

FAMILIES LLIVING WITH RELATIVES More than 3 million families, representing approximately one out of every 12 American families, are living with rela-tives, mostly with parents or in-laws, according to data com-piled by the U. S. Bureau of the Census. The figures are based on a nation-wide sample survey conducted last year and recently made public. Of these "subfamilies," as the Census Bureau classifies them, more than 24, million, or approximately three out of every four, are married couples, most without children. The others are chiefly mother and child families, representing homes broken by separation, divoree or widowhood. The Census Bureau study does not determine the extent to which economic and housing conditions and the rise in living costs in the last few years are responsible for the arge number of families "doubling up" with relatives. The records show that this is not an unusual practice in American life but the number and proportion have increased noticeably since the end of the war. However, evidence that economic conditions are an in-finence is provided by the fact that the majority of these families are young, indicating that they have yet to establish themselves on a secure financial footing, and that the husband is a veteran in more than two of every five cases. Furthermore, about two thrids of the heads of the household with whom these families are living own their homes, a much large rupoyed.

Titanium as Alloy Being Investigated

Investigated The case of pure stianium fur nishes an example of how man-ufacturers research finds sub-stitutes for the earth's resources as they are used up. It is now being sold at \$5 per pound. There is more stitanium than lead, zinc, tin, nickel, copper, gold, and silver together. How-ever, until an Eastern chemi-cal company recently solved the problem, there was little hope that tifanium could be purified. Titanium is as strong as stain-less steel, about half as heavy; several times as strong as alu-minum, less than twice as heavy. With some of our metallic re-sources being used up, experi-ments are under way to test titanium as an alloy.
