Most of the record-breaking 50,000 veterans enrolled this fail in institutions of higher learning in the Los Angeles area will receive their subsistence checks from the Veterans Administration by Nov. 15, it was announced today by L. C. Chapman, manager of the VA Los Angeles Regional Office.

A total of 35,000 checks will be mailed out between 'Nov. 1 and Nov. 10 with veterans who have not been paid before receiving one check for both September and October subsistence. With few exceptions, all fall enrollees will be paid not later than Nov. 20.

The best way the veteran can help himself, Chapman said, is to refrain from writing or calling the VA about overdue subsistence Checks until after Nov. 15.
