With Quarterback Bill Crawford's pitching arm in perfect form, the Tarbabes outscored Beverly Hills B team, 19-12 at the loser's gridiron Thursday afternoon.

Crawford flipped touchdown passes to Lefty Scholl, Dick Carrow and Irvin Kasten to rack up the win. The diminutive quarterback—cousin of the Tartar field general Boyd Crawford—completed all eight passes he attempted for a perfect pitching job.

Torrance and Beverly Hills matched scores in each quarter except the second, when the Tarbabes racked up seven points while holding the BH Bees.

## Locals Stun Normans With 32-7 Attack

Newly found assistance for Tartar Quarterback Boyd Crawford in the ball packing department paid off in touchdowns Friday night at the Torrance High Stadium when our locals slammed their way into the Bay League win column with a 32-7 victory over Beverly Hills.

Pushing across fannies in each quarter, the Tartars were never headed. Coach Eddie Cole's scoring machine amassed 4384 yards rushing and through the air to outscore the Orange and White Normans.

Oddly enough, it was Tartar Center Pete Douroux who started the touchdown parade midway through the first quarter by bulling his way to pay dirt from one yard out. Pete dropped back into the slot behind center and was handed the ball by Guard Frank Costa.

After Co-captain Pete's teedee, virtually everyone got into the act. Jo Clevenger at fullback, Halfback Aramis Dandoy, Crawford and End Wendell Vaughn each galloped into touchdown territory for the Tartars.

Last week they took apart the hopes of Inglewood by a 15-0 trouncing during which Coach Dave Reed's biggie rolled up 488 yards on the ground and through the air against the Sentinels. They plan to have little trouble with Torrance.

Frank and George Johnson—not brothers—will be the wingman targets for Paulsen. John Lewis at fullback, Bill Angelo at left half will be the backfield pass eaters.

Oddly enough, our Tartars are not trembling in their grid shoes over the prospect of the impending battle under the lights at the local high school stadium tomorrow night. In fact, one Tartar lineman who prefers to remain anonymous delicately predicted the outcome of the game this way:

"We'll knock their brains out," Tartar Head Coach Eddie Cole pointed out that although the Leuzinger High record looks impressive, the ever-improving brand of Torrance grid play can quite possibly knock the Blue and White for an unexpected loop.

"Their offense hinges on the superiority of their quarterback, Don Paulsen," Coach Cole stated. "Paulsen is good. But our boy Boyd Crawford spots him 20 (Continued on Page 5)
