## Leuzinger Takes First Bay Loop Title In Upset

The Leuzinger Olympians, Cinderella team of the Bay League, will carry the league's colors into the first round of the CIF playoffs Friday night at Santa Barbara.

The Blue and White won the right to the playoff when it defeated El Segundo, 39-18 Friday night and mailed the first Bay League pennant in the school's history. Although El Segundo offered scrappy resistance, the Olympians were never ruffled. In fact Don Paulsen, quarterback sparkplug for the squad was kept under wraps most of the game.

For the boys from Hawthorne, the victory climaxed a spectacular season. Not rated as a contender for the Bay League crown taken last year by Santa Monica, Leuzinger did nothing to change popular opinion in their first game. With Paulsen injured, they dropped their Bay League opener to Redondo, 15-0.

The defeat was their first and last of the season.

After that the Olympians beat Beverly Hills, 46-6; Inglewood 33-20; our Tartars, 38-0; Jordan, 26-13; and upset the champion Santa Monica's, 26-19.

In winning the Bay League crown, Leuzinger scored 208 to their opponents' 91. Except for the once they were beaten they never scored less than 26 points a game.

## Defeat Oxy 8-1

El Camino water polo squad soundly thrashed a strong Occidental outfit 8-1 in a Southern California Water Polo Conference game last week. The contest, held at Occidental, was the fourth league victory for the Warriors.

Occidental was quick to score, snaring a goal in the first ten seconds of play. From that point on, however, they were held scoreless by the dominating El Camino splashers, who scored at will against the amazed Tiger team.

# Panther Power Claws Local Gridders 34-7 in Last Game

The booming patter of tiny panther feet up and down Jordan field Friday night sounded the staccato accompaniment to the "Tartar gridiron swan song" of 1949. Two of the hardest running backs in this year's Bay League, playing behind seven refugees from a Beefer trust brigade sent Torrance down to a 34-7 defeat in the season finale.

Bill Ingram, the Panthers' great halfback, tallied three touchdowns in the game, with George Timberlake scoring the other two TD's.

The complexion of things to come did not become apparent until the second quarter. In the first frame, the Tartars looked like the better team keeping the Jordans deep in their own territory and twice embarking on what appeared to be destined as

touchdown drives. But in the second frame, the Panther fury broke loose. Ingram punched over the first score of the game when he broke over right guard 24 yards to pay dirt. Cal Coleman added the conversion, and the Radfordmen were off to the races.

Later, Ingram scooted around left end from 22 yards out for a touchdown. It took the Blue and White just 13 plays to go 72 yards. They went 62 yards in eight plays for their first touchdown. Timberlake added the extra point.

Bustin' Bill cut off right guard for his last tally of the evening from the eight-yard line midway in the third stanza. Jack Henley ran the conversion.

Timberlake ended a 74-yard drive by going over right guard for a score in the same period. The Tartars came right back by completing a 74-yard run-pass play from Boyd Crawford to Wendell Vaughn. Crawford pitched a 13-yard aerial to Vaughn who scampered the remaining 61 yards to touchdown land. Crawford added the extra point.

With only 90 seconds left in the fourth quarter, Timberlake sliced six yards through right tackle for the final marker, and Coleman added his second extra point of the night.
