Racial, Religious Prejudice Acquired by Tots in Rompers

It has been the tendency of many experts in the past few years to assume that very young children are not prejudiced. This theory has been blown to bits recently by a survey of thousands of little children in Philadelphia.

The shocking fact of prejudice in children, based on the findings of the Philadelphia Early Childhood Project, are revealed in an article "Is Prejudice Pcisoning our Kids" in the November Woman's Home Companion.

"No child was ever born with racial or religious prejudice," notes the magazine. But this study shows that they acquire it while they're still wearing rompers.

Since children absorb these unhealthy attitudes from various sources, experts in the field offer these suggestions for inoculations against prejudice year by year.

When your child is three that is a good age for him to be gin playing in mixed groups. At four and five, a child should be told about the world. He should know that there are red and black people, Eskimos, Indians and Orientals.

Age nine is a good time for concrete democratic action. It is a good age to visit churches and temples in order to teach child to have a healthy attitude toward other religions

The intellectual approach can come at ten. The child is then ready for facts about minorities, about color lines and about
