State regulations requiring that suspected communicable diseases be reported to the public health department have been called to the attention of local residents by Roy O. Gilbert, Los Angeles County Health Officer following several instances of people being bitten by wild animals.

In this area where rabies is
known to be present an unprovoked bite by an animal deserves investigation. Any warm
blooded animal-is capable of having and transmitting rabies,
the health officer warhed, and
for this reason, it is imperative
that all animal bites be reported
immediately. The County Health
Department maintains a staff
of men to follow up on these
reports and place the animals
under quarantine for observe
tion, Dr. Gilbert bointed out,
and if the animal should prove
to have or should develop rabies
there is imperative need for the
administration of anti-rables serum to the persons bitten.
