Gas bills here and in nearby environs took a lunp year tereday as new interim rates recently established by the Public Utilities Commission became effective.

According to an announcement made by the Southern California as Company, the new rates will apply to gas used on and after February 1, which means that for meters read during the February the charges will be prorated on a daily average is as between the old and the new rates.

The Public Utilities Commission has prescribed a new system of zone rates for general service gas customers. The new rates are divided into six levels, designed to reflect differences in the costs of service to various cities and unincorporated areas. Individual customers will refer area,
