Purchasers of the property Torrance acquired from the Los Angeles School District when the Torrance district was formed was a firm identified as James Starbird an Associates.
Spokesman for the purchasers said they plan to build 80 two-bedroom houses on the property in the northernmost tip of Torrance on Redondo Beach boulevard, They said the houses will be acceptable for G. I. and F.H.A. loans and should be completed within four months. They plan to start work there within a . month.
