Columbia Steel Gets Order to Eliminate Smog

Time allotted the Columbia Steel Corporation to Install smog elimination devices on its four open hearth stacks was reduced from one year to 10 months, following a recent edict handed down by the Los Angeles County Air Pollution Control District.

The demand by the smog board marks the first time in history that a serious attempt has been undertaken to control the emissions from open hearths.

Bothlehem Steel Corporation in Vernon has announced it was installing electric furnaces to solve the problem.

The Hearing Board, headed by Chairman Herbert V. Walker, said yesterday in its order:

"This variance is granted upon the expectation, and any further variances will be considered by this board only upon the condition that within the period of this variance peritioner shall have proceeded with due diligence and speed toward the completion and operation of necessary equipment for bringing the emission from its four open hearth furnaces with in the limits of the law and the rules of the Air Pollution Control District of Los Angeles County."
