
### **Suicide Puzzles Police and Wife** Of Hollis Towler

Carried by the men he had worked with for 13 years, Lester Newton, 53-year-old superIntendent, victim of a sand pit cave-in last Friday, was carried to his final resting place Tuesday, only a short distance from where he lost his life.

Among those attending the rites for the former boss of Chandler's Sand and Gravel pit at 26311 Narbonne avenue, were two of the workers with Newton at the time of the cave-in. The two sand pit workers Carl Dean, 47, of 2414 Pacific Coast highway, and Ed Hughes, 5116 MacAfee - noad, Seasid et Heights, scrambled to safety from beneath an avalanche of 106 tons of sand that claimed Newton's life.

Newton, who lived at 25206 Narbonne avenue, was preparing to place a dynamite charge with the help of Dean and Hughes when the side of the 300-foot sand pit broke loose. The dynamite, 184 sticks, was buried with Newton.
