TORRANCE HERALD NOTICE TO CONTRACTORS
 NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the City Council of the City of Torrance will receive sealed bids until eight o'clock p.m., March 14, 1950, for the construction of the Recreation Building for North Torrance and the Recreation Building for Hollywood Riviera.
 Each bid shall be in accordance with the Uniform Building Code, Uniform Plumbing Code, and Uniform Electrical Code, and the plans now on file in the City Engineer's Office, Room 2, City Hall, Torrance, California.
 In accordance with the Labor Code of the State of California, the owner has ascertained the general prevailing rate of wages for each craft or type of workman needed to execute the contract which will be awarded the successful bidder.
 These prevailing rates are contained in the specifications as follows:

 Apprentices: May be employed in conformity with Section 1777.5 of the California Labor Code.
 Foremen: Foremen shall not be paid less than 17% extra per hour more than the hourly rate of the highest classification over which he has supervision as to the six basic trades, and not less than 12% extra per hour as to the subtrades, more than the journeymen rate for the craft involved.
 Overtime: One and one-half (1½) times the above rates.
 Sundays and Holidays: One and one-half (1½) times the above rates.
 Contractor to perform all work as and when directed by the City Engineer.
THIS CONTRACT IS SET UP IN THREE PARTS AS FOLLOWS:
 Part I.
 The construction for concrete foundation, floors, concrete block or brick work, framing and roofing complete to conform with Uniform Building Code and specifications herein.
 Part II.
 All plumbing to conform with Uniform Plumbing Code and specifications herein.
 Part III.
 Electrical work to conform with Uniform Electrical Code, and specifications herein.
 The Contractor may bid on all three items or any separate item.
 Bids must be made on special proposal form furnished by the City Engineer and must be accompanied by cash certified or cashier's check, or bid bond, payable to City of Torrance, for an amount equal to at least ten per cent (10%) of the amount bid. All bids to be compared on basis of the City Engineer's estimates.
 All bidders must be licensed as per Chapter 791, Statutes of 1929, as amended.

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Plans and form of proposal may be obtained at the office of the City Engineer, City Hall, Torrance, California, upon payment of \$2.00.
 The City Council reserves the right to reject any or all bids, and to take all bids under advisement for not to exceed thirty (30) days after date of opening thereof.
 All bids must be sealed and marked: Bid on Construction of Recreation Building for North Torrance and Bid on Construction of Recreation Building for Hollywood Riviera.
