Scouts Working to Send Youth To National Jamboree in June

This is the year of the great Second National Boy Scout Jamboree, and the Scouts of Troop 241 of Torrance are deep in a fund-raising campaign to send a representative of their troop to this great gathering.

The National Jamboree will be held this year at Valley Forge, Pennsylvania, the historic spot where the small band of patriots under General Washington spent the arduous winter of 1777-1778. Here, during the week of Independence Day, will gather more than 40,000 Scouts and leaders to celebrate the 40th Anniversary of the Boy Scouts of America. These Scouts will come from all over the United States to take part in a fine, adventurous experience in fellowship and Americanism. The members of Troop 241 are very anxious to have Torrance represented.

Scouts from this area will leave for the jamboree on a special Pullman train on June 25. The Scouts will travel through Salt Lake City, Omaha, Chicago, New York City and thence to Valley Forge. At all of these stops the group will take tour of the many places of interest, which will include a yacht trip around Manhattan Island past the Statue of Liberty and a trip through New York City.

At Valley Forge the Scouts will camp for a full week, visit among themselves and get to know Scouts from other parts of our United States. The group will leave Valley Forge on July 7 to spend two days at Washington, D.C., where they will visit the many historic spots in our nation's capital including the White House, the Capitol Building, Mt. Vernon and many others.

The special train will then proceed through Chicago to Yellowstone National Park with an excursion to the many wonderful sights in Yellowstone Valley. The group will return to Los Angeles on July 13 after a trip that will be long remembered.

In an effort to raise the \$313.74, a ridiculously low price for such a trip, to send one Scout to the jamboree, the Scouts of Troop 241 are engaged in several projects. The boys at this time are collecting old newspapers and to date have accumulated several tons which they plan to sell at a good price. In addition to this, the troop held several weeks ago a very successful donut sale which added considerably to the growing fund. Another donut sale is planned for the future and will offer a fine selection of specially made and attractively boxed donuts.

Called the Scenicruiser, the new 43-passenger coach designed by Greyhound engineers offers greater visibility, smoother riding, and more seating comfort than present buses, according to Greyhound officials.

The new coach is now on tour of American cities and will go north after leaving Torrance Sunday night.

Most striking of the new features is the raised dome and wide windshield of the rear passenger compartment. Passengers seated in this section will have a wide, unobstructed view of the surroundings.

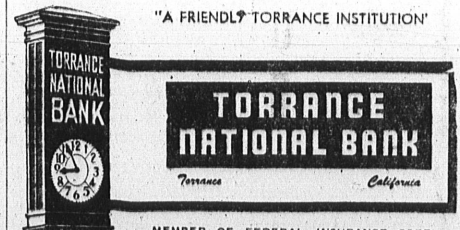
