Clinic Services Outlined by PTA Health Director

Members of Narbonne PTA heard Mrs. L. Brucker, director of the PTA Health Center in San Pedro, give a detailed report of the health services available for all children in the harbor area when she addressed the organization Tuesday afternoon in the Little Theatre at the high school.

She specified the radium treatments given by the asthma clinic as well as the dental work, the many cases of the heart, eyes, tonsils and rheumatic fever which come to the attention of the center throughout the school year. She also spoke of the Child Guidance Clinic and the use of the audiometer in detecting deafness in children.

Mrs. Brucker concluded her talk with a brief resume of the growth of the program of the health center in San Pedro during the 27 years she has been its director.

It was also announced by Mrs. Frank Allen, health chairman, that the X-Ray mobile unit, which has proved helpful in the reduction of infectious cases by early detection, will be in the harbor area in the early fall and that immunization has been responsible for complete elimination of death from smallpox, according to statistics compiled during last year. Ever-mindful of ill health among all children, Tenth District PTA fully realizes that money spent for health of children is truly the best investment any community can make, as they launch their building program to give the area a modern, fully equipped new health center.

Mrs. Minot Rugg presided and the association completed plans to send delegates to the State PTA convention in Santa Cruz May 2. These will include Mrs. Rugg, president; Mrs. J. J. Millard and Mrs. N. W. Nansel. A marathon breakfast will be served to raise funds for convention expenses.

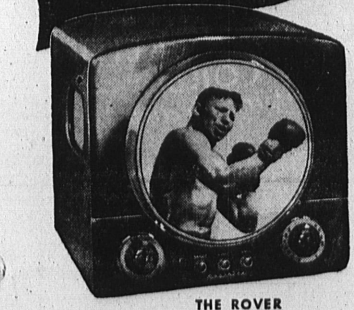
