"I didn't think mine was big enough to qualify." Well, any legal catch would have been good enough for first prize. Of course, it's too late now.

Catching a 17 1/2-inch rainbow trout on May 1 was just what Al Coast needed to step up and claim a Penn-combination reel as a gift from Scotty's Sports Shop, 1421 Marcelina avenue, for his first prize.

Two days earlier—April 29 Van Barnard, operator of the Laundry Lounge at 1627 Graven, had pulled in a German brown trout measuring 17 1/2 inches. For his second-place prize he selected a Langley casting reel offered by Joe Prenevost, operator of Joe's Sports Shop, 2318 Torrance boulevard.

In addition to the prizes claimed by the two winners, the Lovelady Hardware Company, 1967 West Carson street, had offered an all-leather harness and leather-bound reel case, and the Torrance Hardware, 1515 Cabrillo avenue, had offered a Montague split bamboo High-hand fly pole.

Three other nice catches reported to the Herald included a 16 1/2-inch German brown rainbow trout caught by Jack Clayton, and a 16 1/2-inch German brown trout caught by Ed Peil. All were fishing with Barnard, second-place winner.

Al Coast had a nice lake trout to display this week, one that he hooked during the derby.
