A spokesman for the Palos Wordes Corporation stated that the company had reached an agreement with Kazarian for the operation of the dump under a 10-year lease. It is proposed that the material dumped would be covered every six inches with four inches of soil.

The property, would eventually be turned over to the country as a recreational area as the ground would mot be suitable for the construction of permanent buildings, it was said.
