Garbage Might Affect Water, Says Official

Possibility that the use of large excavations near Watteria for cut-and-cover, garbage dumping will affect underground water supplies in this area has been voiced by Carl Fossette, manager of the West Basin Municipal Water District.

"The main water-bearing San Pedro sands which underlie a large portion of West Basin outcrop at the surface in this general area and some thought should, perhaps, be given the advisability of unrestricted depositing of material which might be leaching find its way into underground formations," Fossette stated.

Fossette, who also is secretary of the West Basin Water Association, a producers organization, said that all area near the Great Lakes Carbon Corp. excavations, which would be used for the waste dumping, is under consideration as a water-spreading site.

"There is also the thought that a potentially valuable water-spreading site would be lost," the water official added.

He revealed that a Los Angeles refuse contractor is seeking a permit to utilize the depressions. A special hearing on the request is scheduled for June 16 before the zoning board of the Regional Planning Commission.

Judge Shidler Opens Campaign For Reelection

Judge John A. Shidler, incumbent Justice of the Peace, Gardena Township, this week announced the beginning of his campaign for reelection on June 6.

"My platform," said Judge Shidler, "is a promise to provide the same impartial judicial service in the future as I have in the past."

Pointing out that he has dealt with more than 23,000 criminal and more than 3,000 civil matters in the past three years, Judge Shidler stated that no tickets had been fixed or other special privileges shown in his courts during his nine years of judicial service.

"No campaign funds have been or will be accepted from any source," Judge Shidler asserted. "A Judge finds it peculiarly easy to solicit contributions if he is so inclined."

While all veteran groups, church, business, industry, CIO, AFL, Teamsters and other labor and party organizations have endorsed him or indicated their favor, Judge Shidler will not publicize these endorsements.

"I am not connected with any other candidate in any way," Judge Shidler continued. "I have consistently refused offers of candidates for assembly, congress, senate, and governor to participate in their campaigns and to share their supporters. I shall continue to do so."

"I am grateful for that word-of-mouth help which those who know me are giving. I shall avoid the use of bill boards, window cards, telephone pole signs, handbills and automobile stickers," Judge Shidler concluded.

Letters To The Editor

In a memorandum received by this office through the mail on May 23, 1950, concerning the present election contest, the writer was informed that "Torrance is a city of the sixth class," as has been the contention of the legal talent on the other side of the issue ever since the contest was instituted.

If that is true, the City of Torrance is sure do not have any control whatsoever over their public schools. In the event such a statement should be included in any judgment, it would deprive the City of the very schools for which the present charter was prepared to take from the control of Los Angeles County. If such is true, why did the City spend thousands of dollars on the election which was required by the Constitution as preliminary to the acquiring of a freeholder charter? Why did the City go through all the legal ramifications if the City of Torrance was to remain a city of the sixth class? Torrance, at the time the election was held, was a city of the sixth class and had been such from the time of its incorporation.

The trouble lies in the inability of the legal talent to determine what the term "alternative" means as used in the Constitution of the State of California. If John Doe desires to throw a ball across the street, and the rule laid down says it must be thrown with the right arm, but the rule further states that, as an alternative, the ball might be thrown with the left arm, what is the difference? The desired result is to get the ball across the street—right hand or left hand. The result is the same. The same rule applies in either case. It is merely a matter of procedure. Electors may elect fifteen freeholders to throw the ball or the five on the City Council may throw it. The throwing of the ball is immaterial—it is bringing home the bacon that counts.

The City wanted a freeholders charter. One of the principal reasons for wanting it was to get control of its own schools which, as a city of the sixth class, under the law, was not permitted. Another reason the City wanted to be a freeholder charter city was to have what is known in legal parlance as a "home rule" city, which in the same parlance is identical with a freeholder charter city. It is not the name that is given the charter but what the charter contains that is the meat in the coconut.

I do not know of a better or more laconic way in which to express my thought concerning the interpretation placed upon this matter by the opposition than by saying "HORSE FEATHERS."

Insurance Law Seen In Plane Buzzing Probe

Introduction into the state legislature of a "compulsory" public liability insurance law for airplanes was seen today as an outgrowth of charges that low-flying pilots operating out of Torrance Municipal airport are endangering the life and property of nearby Lomita citizens.

Assemblyman Vincent Thomas, San Pedro, Democrat, said that the legislation was indicated following a meeting with representatives of the complaining Lomita citizenry, the airport, the Civil Aeronautics Authority, the sheriff's department, and the city of Torrance.

Such legislation would be modeled after the auto law which now requires that motorists carry \$11,000 in public liability insurance or post the same amount following an accident in which damage is more than \$100.

The bill would be introduced when the legislature convenes next Jan. 3 with an urgency clause to make it immediately effective upon passage.

Confederate Max I. Black, who represented the C.A.A., promised to survey the situation and sound out the Authority on sponsoring the legislation.

The group, which included Anti-Buzzers Victoria, M. Phillips, president of the Lomita Property Owners and Registered Voters Association, and Malcolm Cameron, were unanimous in not wanting to abandon the airfield, Thomas stated.
