Tax Specialists Needed in Japan

Top level civilian tax administrators and specialists are being sought by the Department of the Army to fill vacancies in Japan. It was reported this week by Winona Ellis, manager of the California Department of Employment office in Torrance. Positions are open for persons who have had five years or more professional tax experience in state, county, or city tax revenue agencies. This experience should include responsible work in taxation procedures and methods in legalized revenue producing sources. Successful applicants must accept a two-year assignment in Japan. Salary is \$6400 or \$7000 a year, depending upon the applicant's experience. In addition, dependents, household goods and private car of the person employed may be shipped overseas.

Trash-Burning Hours Changed in County Area

Open-fire and incinerator burning in unincorporated County territory will be restricted to the hours of 6 to 10 a. m. daily, according to an ordinance adopted last Thursday by the Board of Supervisors.

These burning hours conform to those now prevailing in the City of Los Angeles, Chief Spence D. Turner of the Los Angeles County fire department declared.
